Dear Employment Ontario delivery partners,

As the COVID-19 pandemic has left many people without a job or limited opportunities to find work, it remains the Ontario government's priority to support laid-off workers to retrain for a new career. The Second Career program continues to help laid-off workers pay for tuition and living expenses for those who want to participate in training for in-demand occupations.

Since the implementation of Redesign Phase 1 in December 2020, the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development has continued its efforts to improve the Second Career program.

Today, the government has announced the second phase (Phase 2) of the Second Career Redesign with additional program changes that will provide better support to participants in their journey to a new career path.

As you may be aware from the training sessions which took place in the last few weeks, alongside the implemented changes in Phase 1, the Phase 2 Redesign includes the following key enhancements made to the program:

- A new funding model to simplify the application process, which will determine:
 - the support amounts clients receive using a mixture of actual costs and flat rate amounts where possible, adjusted based on need; and
 - o updated support amounts to reflect the current cost of living.
- Improved client experience by streamlining the application process, including:
 - o updated PDF application forms; and
 - a pilot project to test a newly developed digital portal to access online application.

It is anticipated that the Phase 2 changes will improve participant access and experience by reducing administrative burden and enabling the program to more efficiently respond to participant demand.
