I am pleased to share a significant milestone in our ongoing efforts to protect Ontario workers and address the impacts of U.S. tariffs on our communities, employers and key sectors through today's announcement of the Protect Ontario Workers Employment Response (POWER) Centres.

In May 2025, the government committed to investing an additional \$20 million in 2025-2026 to help support workers affected by layoffs and sectors threatened by the changing economic environment.

POWER builds on and enhances the existing ministry-supported Adjustment Advisory Program Action Centres. These centres have helped and continue to help workers, sectors and communities adapt to economic changes while providing workers, who are affected by layoffs, a temporary place to receive services and supports, including job search assistance and referrals to training.

POWER Centres enhancements include building and expanding partnerships to leverage additional resources and expand access to additional training opportunities to support workers, communities, and sectors. Other enhancements include digital access to training and supports, referrals to in-demand training and re-employment supports based on timely assessments of job seekers and local workforce needs and creating training opportunities within the POWER Centres to best support workers.
